
Professional Speed Mentoring Day

Thursday 8th February 2018








The aim of this day was to encourage students to explore a diverse range of career paths, and to give them the opportunity to discover routes into careers which they may not have previously considered.

and 11 students.




Each interviewer was asked how useful they felt the Speed Mentoring event was to our students.

"It was very useful for the students and interesting to see what they asked. I was advising students to stay motivated and keep going."


"Very enjoyable first time attendee. Real mix of students - some very focussed, others a very long way from knowing what they would like to do."

"I really enjoyed speaking to the youth."




Despite a few nerves, our students really seemed to enjoy the experience.

Each student was asked to complete a feedback sheet on the day of the event. Their feedback is detailed on the following pages:







Did you find the Event useful?

Do you think that the time allowed for questions and answers was:







Has this event given you the information you would have liked to be given?
